## **Stewardship**

#### We Give

To belong to our congregation is to be a steward. Some may say that "stewardship" is just a polite way of referring to financial giving to the church. But it's far more than that.

One character in some of Jesus' parables is the steward — the servant charged by the master to care for the master's property. It is the master, not the steward, who owns the property, but the steward is responsible for it and is accountable to the master. So it is, said Jesus, between God and us. As God's stewards we have three responsibilities:

- *Receiving:* We receive with joyful thanksgiving the many gifts that God showers upon us time, talent, treasure, our bodies, our friendships, natural resources, and the beauty around us.
- *Managing:* We take good care of what we have received. We manage these resources wisely for our own good and the good of others.
- *Giving*: Out of our gratitude in receiving so abundantly, we want to share with others. Let's look at four kinds of gifts that we receive, manage, and share:

#### **Our time**

We did nothing to earn the hours, the days, the weeks of our lives. Time is a gift of God. How we choose to use it is a matter of stewardship. Some people lead lives of frenetic activity, always over-extending themselves to the point of exhaustion, while others sit around in apathetic boredom. Some spend all their hours serving the needs of others at the expense of their own, while others live only for themselves.

As Christian stewards we try to manage time wisely and in a balanced way. And we give our time gladly to family and friends, to strangers, to the community, the church, and to ourselves.

#### Our abilities

Do you remember Jesus' parable of the three servants who received different amounts of money to manage while the master was away? We've each received from God distinctive gifts and talents. How we develop and use these talents is a matter of stewardship. Like two of the servants in Jesus' story, we can invest them wisely — or like the third, out of fear we can hide them (Matthew 25:14-30).

As stewards, we acknowledge the gifts we have without apology. We develop them further, practicing new skills and putting our talents to work in ministry.

#### Our resources

We may think that our financial resources are our own. But when we recall that the time, the energy, the good health, and the opportunities for employment behind these dollars are all gifts from God, we see that the funds belong to God too. We are the stewards; God is the owner. So questions about what we earn, how we earn it, how we save, spend, and give it away, are all questions of Christian stewardship.

One vital aspect of our stewardship is our giving to Christ's work in the world. We've learned that giving is most effective when we commit ourselves to give a definite proportion of our income through the church. For many, this proportion is one-tenth, or a tithe. Whatever the amount, we have discovered the joy in giving to God the "first fruits," an amount "off the top" of our income, not what's left over at the end of the month.

We have also enjoyed the management and staff of our local U.S. Bank branch, who came as part of their #communitypossible initiative, to volunteer with our Project Grace meal.

Even with this progress, we are wisely concerned with the cost of providing this meal and hosting the various clinics here each week. It is good and right that we ask hard questions and seek creative solutions about this! Several members of PB UMC as well as our capable Finance team are working to address these concerns as well. In doing so, we continue to form community connections, and have begun conversation with a well-respected member of PB who can help us in both relationship-building and in fund-

raising. In addition, we are actively seeking support from other congregations who are either seeking ways to broaden their missions impact, or who have available grants. Please take a moment to thank our capable Finance team as well as those who regularly volunteer as part of our Project Grace team.

We have achieved a major milestone with our Labor of Love project that addresses important maintenance and improvements in our Sanctuary. Please be sure to connect with a member of our Labor of Love team for more details about the project and to know more about what work has been taking place.

We recently gathered together with leaders of this congregation to begin a process of discerning how God is calling us forward into continued ministry in Pacific Beach. Led by Rev. Dr. Cedrick Bridgeforth, we experienced both laughter and challenging conversation. And yet in authenticity and grace, we were able to:

- recognize ministries with positive energy/momentum;
- state where our congregation is struggling and/or concerned;
- develop important questions we should be asking of ourselves.

This has been made possible through the leadership of our VUE (Visioning, Uniting, Expanding) team, who have contracted with Rev. Dr. Bridgeforth to continue to guide us in this process. We will prayerfully continue to discern God's vision for this congregation's ministry in Pacific Beach.

Finally, we have experimented during our summer months with a new worship format, and our Growing in Faith team has elected to continue this new modern worship experience. This has not been an easy decision, and we continue to receive feedback from members of the congregation. Some very strongly prefer the more traditional format, and others are ecstatic about the new format and the conversation times. Our team continues to wrestle with these differing views, and some changes based on feedback have already taken place. We are grateful for the ongoing ways that we discern how to create worship environments that will feed the spiritual needs of our community. Please take a moment to connect with a member of this faithful team and to thank them for their spirit-filled work.

So many people are bringing energy and light to the ministries of this faithful congregation. Truly, we are a village, caring for God's community and connected in the Spirit of God's love. May God continue to guide and strengthen us...

## Worshippers Targeted by Gift Card Scam

he Consumer Education Department of the FTC reports they are seeing a new spin on gift card scams. Scammers are pretending to be a pastor, rabbi, priest, imam, or bishop. They're

asking worshippers for gift card contributions for a worthy cause. Appeals are often made by email, but people are also getting texts and phone calls.

The bogus emails often include the name of the local pastor and a legitimate looking email address. But a closer look should raise some red flags. For example, the email address isn't the one normally used by the church, and the service provider is different, too. The message may begin with a simple "Hi," but doesn't include a recipients' name. There also may be spelling errors, including the pastor's name.

The imposter asks you to buy a popular gift card such as iTunes, Google Play, or Amazon, then asks for the gift card number and PIN on the back of the card. Those numbers let the scammer immediately get the money you loaded onto the card. Once that's done, the scammer and your money are gone, usually without a trace.

If you or someone you know paid a scammer with a gift card, report it as soon as possible. Call the card company and tell them the gift card was used in a scam.





## Meet One of Our Voices of Praise: Cambria Metzinger

ot long ago, I noticed we had a new member in our Voices of Praise. Her name is Cambria M. and she has been a Voice of Praise choir member since she started attending PB UMC in May. I was excited to get to know her.

I asked Cambria how she found out about PB UMC, and what made her join. She told me, "I was looking for a church to get involved in as a member of a choir. I posted my interest on Facebook. PB UMC pianist and choir accompanist Laura Williams answered, letting me know about PB UMC. She sent me a flyer about the church with a description of the mu-

sic. I came to PB UMC soon after that and sat in on a choir rehearsal. I got a wonderful sense of community in the choir. We held hands and said a prayer after the rehearsal was finished. I wanted to be part of this community. Everyone made me feel so welcome." I asked if she was involved with any activity besides the choir, and she said, "The choir is an amazing experience for me. Later, I may participate in other church activities."

I have been amazed at Cambria since her first Sunday at PB UMC. Almost every Sunday she sang at least a small solo. When the rest of the choir was on summer break, Cambria sang several solos during the services. She is a junior at San Diego State with a major in Vocal Performance, which is all classical music. When she graduates, she plans on getting a masters in Vocal Performance. She told me, "After I get my masters, I would love to be a professional opera singer, and still have performance expertise so I can teach. My big dream is to have a voice studio."

I asked her if she had anything else to share with us and she answered, "My boyfriend Diego L. works at Our Lady of Grace Church, but he did join us singing in our choir one Sunday recently." Anything else? "I am so grateful to be here. Ron and Louis are so wonderful. They are real inspirations. I am so grateful for all the leaders at PB UMC. It's a gem."
