Pacific Beach UMC once again prepares to enter into the season of Lent. In the Christian tradition, Lent is a time of prayerful introspection in preparation for the Easter celebration. The season begins on Ash Wednesday and lasts for 40 days (not including Sundays). This year, Lent runs from February 26 (Ash Wednesday) through April 11 (the Saturday before Easter).

**Throughout the Lenten season**, we will continue to explore gratitude, guided by author and theologian Diana Butler Bass and her book *Grateful: The Subversive Practice of Giving Thanks*. Video-based small group studies organized by Adam M.-L. will have options for in-person and virtual connections, and our regular weekly communications will all focus on the central idea of gratitude. On Sunday, April 5, we will celebrate Palm Sunday, beginning our worship gathering in our courtyard and processing (walking together) into the Sanctuary together as we sing and wave palm branches. The message will focus on Jesus' traditional procession into Jerusalem before the Passover holiday.

Good Friday falls on April 10. The church will be open from 5:00 pm to 7:30 pm for an exploration of the meaning of Good Friday in our unique life of faith. Stations of interactive prayer and learning will be available for participants at an individual pace.

On Easter Sunday, April 12, we will gather once again for a Sunrise Worship at Crown Point Park on Mission Bay. We will join together with members of The Water's Edge faith community at 6:00 am for worship and a service of Holy Communion.

Back at 1561 Thomas Ave, our **Worship services** will take place as usual in the sanctuary at 9:00 am and 10:30 am. The **Easter Egg Hunt** for children will begin in the courtyard at 10:00 am.

Easter is a celebration of hope and new life. All are welcome to join in thoughtful reflection, prayer, community, worship, and celebration. Please be sure to invite family, friends, and neighbors to join this remarkable faith community as we continue to connect with one another and with God.

## Pastor Bob's Printed Blog

Dear Friends ...

s I sit with my laptop on my lap and a television show clattering in the background of my attention, it is after 1:30 am on Monday, February 17<sup>th</sup>. It's President's Day, and at this late (or early) hour, I just got home from the church.

I was called down shortly before midnight by news of a break-in on the north side of the Sanctuary.

If this is the first you've heard of this, please take a moment, and take a breath. Nothing was taken and the person responsible never entered the building before being stopped by our on-site security. When I arrived, police were there and had someone in the back of their vehicle. It was not someone I have ever seen before. But the break-in is not what I want to explore here.

We are incredibly blessed to have our capable on-site security person, Easy, who saw what was happening on a routine tour of the church grounds. He was able to reach me, and I got to the church shortly thereafter. While Easy was calling local police for assistance, a neighbor offered support, and stayed to speak with responding officers. When it became time to secure the Sanctuary, Maddie, the coordinator for our weekly dental clinic came to help. The ever-responsive Louis P. responded to a call for help and directed us to tools and plywood. We were even checked in on by one of our regular Project Grace volunteers, who walked by while pushing his bike.

Between us, we managed to board up the space where the glass had been kicked out. As of this writing, there is still work to be done to complete the cleanup and make the board-up job a bit prettier.

It occurred to me that this is an incredible illustration of community. In a time of need, people came together and worked together. There was connection. There was community.

This is not unlike what I suspect many of us have experienced in this congregation. Perhaps we have been in a time of crisis, and we have been supported and guided by our church family. Perhaps we have faced a difficult task, and we have been aided and counseled by members of our church family. Perhaps we have faced questions of life or of faith, and we have received guidance and care

from members of our church family.

I believe that connection and community are a critical part of our faith. Our recent sermon series, "Somos del Señor," reminded us that we already have the gifts we need; that we are called by God; that God's Spirit continues to empower and strengthen us; and that God joins us in the transformational work before us.


What more can we do together? How can we grow in our faith and discipleship, in our presence in—and service to—the Pacific Beach community? How can we look even beyond our own congregation toward cooperation and collaboration with other churches to do new things in new ways, and reach new people?

It can feel easy to isolate ourselves out of fear rather than to allow our loved ones and our faith community to see and acknowledge our authentic selves, but by courageously opening our hearts, I believe we find new strength and new hope. In the same way, it can feel easy for churches to separate our congregations into silos rather than to cooperate and collaborate in fresh expressions of faith, but in connecting and collaborating, I believe we can find new strength and new hope.

As we enter into this Lenten season, may God continue to call us toward connection, toward faith, toward growth, and toward community.

he Labor of Love project has been making quiet progress over the last year. # Last Call for Interfaith Shelter Program Volunteers at PB UMC

Pacific Beach United Methodist church continues its longstanding ministry to the homeless community by hosting guests from the Interfaith Shelter Network March 21 to April 4, 2020. We have openings for volunteers in several areas.

#### What Can I Do?

We still need some individuals or groups to serve as lunch and dinner hosts. Lunch sacks are prepared the evenings before the assigned date and are dropped off at the church around 6:00 pm. Dinner hosts prepare meals and serve the guests around 6:15 pm. The church's kitchen is available for use for all meal preparation. If you need to drop off lunches earlier, no problem. If you want to arrive at the church early to prepare your gourmet meal, there's no worries there, either. After our guests finish their meal, they help clean the kitchen, and then settle in for the evening. Each evening an overnight supervisor is there: another area where you can participate as a volunteer. Overnight supervisors get to eat dinner with our shelter guests.

#### Where, Do I Begin?

Before and after worship services, look at the sign-up sheets located in the church lobby for the open volunteer opportunities. If you have any questions, just ask any of the coordinators (Betty, Ray, or Ken).

hurch Council gathered for our first meeting on February 11. We elected officers: Ken B., chair; David McC., vice chair; and Terre F., secretary. Hope A. was previously elected treasurer at the church conference.

For the next part of the meeting, the Council members split into subject area groups of Trustees, Staff-Parish Relations (SPRC), and Finance.

The trustee group reported that demolition has started at the house that the church owns on Reed Ave. Reconstruction from the fire could take a year. Fortunately, as has been reported previously, our insurance coverage includes lost rent. The staff-parish group is seeking an additional nursery worker. Finance prepared a budget to be voted on at the next Church Council meeting on March 10, 2020.



## **Meet Pianist Judy B.**

recently met our newest piano player, Judy B. She told me, "Ron Jessee was my Master Teacher back in the late 70's at Spring Valley Junior High. Recently he invited me to sing with the PB UMC choir whenever he needed someone to fill in. Then, when a pianist moved out of town, he asked if I was interested in accompanying the choir, and I took the opportunity."

I asked her if playing the piano in our church had been what she expected. She told me, "I have to work harder than I have previously, because I haven't accompanied in a while. But I love it."

She told me she first learned to play the piano and read music when she was in kindergarten. "Of course, I hated to practice, and my parents didn't want to force me into music, so I stopped taking lessons. However, I would come home from Sunday school and play songs by ear, eventually learning to play with both hands. In 7<sup>th</sup> grade our pastor's wife, who was a phenomenal musician, saw something in me and nurtured that gift. When they moved on to another church a year later, I was in 8<sup>th</sup> grade and became the church pianist until they could find a college student to play regularly. God kept putting me in places that would stretch me as a pianist, because He had a plan for me. Little did I know that I

would be teaching most of my choirs from the piano."

I asked if there is something special music means to her, and she told me, "It is so much a part of who I am. It brings me such joy, whether I'm singing, playing, or directing. It was one of the greatest sources of healing in a very difficult time in my life. God speaks to me and through me using music."

When I asked her what she does for a living, she told me. "For my day job, I work as an Accountant for a Cyber Security company, and for fun, I direct Musical Theater with Scripps Theatre Arts." I asked if she had something else to share with us and she told me, "I am married to a great guy, Wes, and have two beautiful grown daughters, who have given us three energetic grandsons."

Judy shared with me, "If the Lord opens a door for me to minister in music, I will be there."
