

We struggle with the reality that our expenses exceed income in recent years. It's a problem faced by many congregations. Fortunately, through the generosity of bequests to the church, we are not short of cash. But we have a responsibility to maintain these endowments for the future of the church, and not spend them down. The 2023 draft budget has a large deficit, and Council will do our best to pare expenses to a reasonable number.

For the long term, Council plans to consider how we might reimagine our congregation and use of the church campus to put us on a stable financial footing. Reflections From the Finance Team

Apologies from your treasurer: we included a \$13,597 restitution check in the September numbers that understated our expenses. In November we returned \$13,084, keeping only our \$500 deductible plus interest, to the insurance company. This money was for a 2019 embezzlement expense that was covered by our insurance.

In previous years we removed such extraordinary items from our tables. Because I overlooked this step, the September expenses and net revenue numbers in last two issues of the Beach Breeze were misleadingly rosy. This month, November expenses look higher than they really were, and the year to date numbers are accurate.

January Communion Offering Human Relations Day

Human Relations Day is a denominationwide Special Sunday designed to further the development of better human relations by involving congregations in community and youth outreach.

Funds received support community developer programs that strive to build, maintain, promote, and strengthen racialethnic minority congregations through local UMC congregations.

In addition, funds received support the United Methodist Voluntary Services (UMVS) that serves as a resource to congregations, volunteer-based groups, and programs that challenge unjust political, social, and economic systems which threaten the livelihoods of people.

Another portion of the funds received support rehabilitation. These programs work to strengthen youth empowerment programs that provide positive avenues for youth participation in their communities through churches, mentoring programs, and boys/girls clubs.


