## Lea Ann Walker - A Life of Love and Service

With deep sorrow but also with great thankfulness for her remarkable life we announce the passing of Lea Ann Walker on Saturday January 4, 2025 at the Scripps Memorial Hospital ICU in San Diego, CA. Lea Ann was born in Enid, OK on May 11,1943 and lived in Enid until 1961. She married her husband Patrick Walker in November of 1962 while they were students at Oklahoma State and the University of Oklahoma. The times were uncertain because of the Cuban missile crisis and the threat of nuclear war. But Lea Ann and Pat believed instead that it was the right time to begin a marriage. The following 22 years included moving the family 17 times all over the world as Pat served in the US Army. In 1966, Lea Ann gave birth to son Chris Walker in Frankfurt, Germany. Daughter Melissa was born at Fort Sill, OK in 1969.

Throughout her life as a military family member, Lea Ann worked tirelessly to improve the lives of all service families. She was largely responsible for leading the military to change from referring to family members as dependents. Now military family members are important team members in service to the nation. Lea Ann's contributions to this policy change were recognized and praised by all the Personnel Departments of the Joint Chiefs of Staff. In civilian life, Lea Ann continued to volunteer and lead church and civic groups in San Diego.

Lea Ann was also a gifted musician and started and led many choirs in both military and civilian communities. After the family moved to San Diego in 1984, Lea Ann and Pat joined the San Diego Master Chorale and Lea Ann later became the president of their board of directors for two terms. She also did solo and small group singing with the chorale and several churches in the area and was head of the Choral Conductors Guild in San Diego. In 1990 Lea Ann changed her music arranging and ghostwriting business to a family partnership video production company recording the performing arts. In 1998 Walker Vision Interarts was chosen as the on-screen video producer for the San Diego Symphony. For the next 17 years, all of the SDSO pop series concerts were performed with video images shot and live edited by Lea Ann and her family. She met and worked closely with management, musicians and stage workers on program concerts. It was a joyful time.

From 2015 through 2024 she continued to live joyfully singing and volunteering with the Pacific Coast Chorale and the choir at Pacific Beach United Methodist Church. Lea Ann and Pat celebrated their 62nd year of marriage on November 23, 2024. Her love of music and celebration of special holiday dress-ups and care for plants and flowers brought smiles and light to so many who knew her. Her great spirit and lovely voice will be missed. But her love and the light she shined will continue to brighten the hearts of all she touched.


